My school sent my information late and I lost a scholarship. So I stayed over the summer which took up some of my pell grant. Now I owe more during the year than I have to pay it.

I lost my aid the first time around when i was trying to be full time student and working long hours. I put alot on myself and was stressing alot. the scholarship you all gave me helped me and i did great during summer school.

I received a certain amount of financial aid but the amount I was granted doesn't cover all of my classes. That's not including the books that I would have to find at a reasonable price. My classes are my main concern though. Honestly I'm about to have my first son in January and I don't have the extra funding to apply to my schooling. Just need a jumpstart to help me stay on track.

My current situation is very difficult to discuss. Less than a month ago on September 19th, I received an emergency phone call to rush home without any idea of what was going on. When I arrived, my father informed me that my mother had passed away in her sleep. She wasn't sick or anything, it was just sudden. Since then I have not been the same mentally or emotionally. When she passed, I ended up staying home to be with family for a week and a half. However, I am or was a nursing student and ended up falling pretty far behind and missing clinical's. The nursing program at my school does not make exceptions when it comes to missing clinical's nor falling behind so I was directed to withdraw from the program.

Financially I have an outstanding balance with the university per the attachment I sent. I put myself on a monthly plan to pay it off by the end of the semester so that I did not get deregistered and could proceed with my studies in the spring. I only work 3 times out of the month back home and I missed the first payment due to not having it ready the day after my mom had passed.

My dad works as well but he also takes care of my 5 younger siblings ages 4, 5, 8, 16, and 19 (in college) so I do not ask him for anything especially knowing he is still grieving.
